Contrapasso

Contrapasso (or, in modern Italian, contrappasso) is derived from the Latin *contra* and *patior*, which mean "suffer the opposite". Contrapasso refers to the punishment of souls in Dante's *Inferno*, "by a process either resembling or contrasting with the sin itself." A similar process, though a penitential one, occurs in the *Purgatorio*. One of many examples of contrapasso occurs in the 4th Bolgia ...

Convivio

Convivio (Italian pronunciation: [koˈviːvjo]; The Banquet) is a work written by Dante Alighieri roughly between 1304 and 1307. This unfinished work of Dante consists of four *trattati*, or "books": a prefatory one, plus three books that each include a *canzone* (long lyrical poem) and a prose allegorical interpretation or commentary of the poem that goes off in multiple thematic directions.
